Matthew 25:14-30, Living Your Best 2018

Each year I tend to shop on Black Friday. There are a couple of stores that I like to go to. I like Target, Old Navy, Gap, Origins skin care, and Yankee Candles. One of my favorites is the Disney Store. The Disney Store makes me happy. I just love all of those great Disney characters. Now that my kids are older Elliott gets extra purchasing attention when I shop there! That lucky little guy. It is a delight to give each Christmas. I just love seeing the faces of my loved ones as they open up the gifts.

I have once heard that "to whom much is given much is expected." Although, in today's scripture we see that "to whom anything is given much is expected." Let's read today's passage from Matthew 25:14-30.

#1 - 5 talents

At once he went off and traded. He traded and made 5 more talents

"Well done good and trustworthy servant, you have been trustworthy with a few things. I will put you in charge of many things; enter into the joy of your master."

#2 - 2 talents
He made 2 more talents.
Said the exact same thing as for #1
He got two and made two.

He got five and made five.

#3 - 1 talent

Dug a hole in the ground and hid his master's money.

"Master, I knew that you were a harsh man, reaping where you did not sow, and gathering where you did not scatter seed; so I was afraid, and I went and hid your talent in the ground. Here you have what is yours."

"Master replied, You wicked and lazy slave! You knew, did you, that I reap where I did not sow, and gathered where I did not scatter? Then you ought to have invested my money with the bankers, and on my return I would have received what was my own with interest. So take the talent from him, and give it to the one with the ten talents. For to all those who have, more will be given, and they will have an abundance; but from those who have nothing, even what they have will be taken away."

The third man did nothing with his talent. He only hid it. This just doesn't make sense. He knows that he needs to be productive with his work.

Look deeper at #3 -

Knowing the ethics of the master hid the talent out of fear and concern. Focused on fear instead of faith. Since it is New Years Eve let's break this down. God our Heavenly Master is giving us the gift of a new year. He is giving us 365 days. How will we invest that gift?

Which one of the workers will we be in 2018? That is our choice. Let's first look at the fear that paralyzed the 3rd servant. The fear that made him ineffective.

I once had a mentor of mine that said, "Fear is <u>False Evidence</u> <u>Appearing Real." It is in our imagination, we picture the monsters.</u>

We anticipate the bad outcomes. We focus on the negative potential outcomes. This makes us react in an overly protective way. We dig a hole to put the money in. Fear keeps us from stepping out in faith.

That is what the evil one wants us to do. The evil one wants us to be so obsessed with evil, injustice, fear, and potential failures that we cannot step out in faith or just don't step out. Faith is too scary when fear is in control.

God is calling us out of fear into faith in 2018. Looking back on 2017 how did we fare? Did we accomplish a lot? Where did we get tripped up by fear?

Galatians 5:22 "By contrast, the fruit of the spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control."

The Holy Spirit in us gives us the great gifts of mercy and peace. When we yield to the Holy Spirit in our relationships we make the difficult decision to bolster others and that results in the fruit of the Spirit. The victory may be self-control. The victory may be faithfulness. The victory may be patience. Yielding to the Holy Spirit in our lives brings great fruit.

I am reminded of Hebrews 11:1.

Hebrews 11:1 "Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen."

Looking towards 2018 we hope for so many things. May faith give us great assurance that we are headed in a God ordained direction as we walk with Jesus. May we believe God for great things and dare to step out in faith. The Bible says that "Man plans his way but the Lord orders His steps." As we step out in

faith the plans of the Lord will emerge. He will order your steps and show you His good and perfect will!

God's grace surrounds us and helps us to embrace the merciful work of Christ. Ephesians 2:8-9 says, "For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God."

I challenge you to commit to regular church attendance in 2018. When we are surrounded by the things of God we truly are blessed as God works in our lives. Also, I encourage you to download the "Gideon's Bible Ap" for your commute or kitchen duty. This will help you to be constantly reminded about God's grace and the mercy of faith.

We are reminded in Romans 10:17, "So faith comes from what is heard, and what is heard comes through the word of Christ." It builds our faith to listen to the Bible, Christian Music, come to church, be in a Bible Study, or have a prayer partner.

Psalm 56:3 "Oh most High, when I am afraid, I put my trust in you." So, today I say to man #3 - put your trust in God!

Putting our blind trust in God in all things springs us forth to make a difference. As we go with God in 2018 may we put all of our trust in Him.
